	<p>the biological treatment plant which produces methane and then ultimately creates renewable energy in form of electricity. This is a 20 year project.</p> <p>The benefit is that 70% of waste is diverted away from landfill.</p> <p>The brochure explains the process.</p> <p>Air, water, traffic and odour impacts are included in the studies done for the purpose of the EA.</p> <p>PT – raised that there is an issue about odours and that people cannot contact the 1800 number.</p> <p>RM – queried whether it was the WSN or the Council number since no one else has complained about this</p> <p>A community member said they never had a problem</p> <p>PT – informed the CAC that Council had made a resolution that they should write to WSN about the number not working.</p> <p>PT – mentioned that if the life of the facility at Lucas Heights was to be extended then the 1800 number is very important.</p> <p>SH – The proposed facility is enclosed and reduces odour. Do not anticipate odour going beyond boundary. The facility is due to close in 2024. Beyond 2024 the remaining residual waste that cannot be recovered during the process will be landfilled off-site.</p> <p>DE – was a heritage study conducted.</p> <p>SH – thought that the Gandangara people had been contacted.</p> <p>DE – The people of this area are the <b>Dharawal</b>; the actual family clan which roamed the Lucas heights tip area were the <b>Norongerrigals</b>. DE suggested that Les Bursill be contacted as he is an expert</p> <p>PT – this was an area of contention</p> <p>SH – will look into what the studies found. Encouraged DE to make a submission to the DoP about this issue.</p> <p>SH – EA report is to be placed on WSN website and available at DoP and Council.</p> <p>PT – Community needs to be assured there are to be no impacts. Will this affect the playing fields?</p> <p>RM – No</p> <p>SH – closure of landfill will not change</p> <p>RM – Drop off area for community will continue beyond landfill closure date. Concerns can be raised during exhibition period.</p> <p>PT – will mini-bike club be affected?</p> <p>RM – club is being moved and is already under construction.</p> <p>SH – any residue beyond 2024 will be transported off site.</p>

3.	<p><b>Community Feedback on Odours</b></p> <p>JR commented that odours in previous years had not seemed as bad as this year, and that he is more aware of odour levels as he is home more</p> <p>RM suggested this may be because of failures which are becoming apparent in some of gas wells in Stage 5 and that last year gas wells were able to be repaired before the winter in contrast to this one</p>
